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Board Orientation	Date first approved: October 20, 2022
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The orientation of new Board members is necessary in order for there to be a common and shared understanding of the authority and role of the Library Board. This policy sets out the requirements for Board orientation.

- 1. For individuals filling a vacant position on the Board during its term, the CEO/Chief Librarian and the Board Chair will provide those new members with a thorough orientation within two months of their appointment to the Library Board that will include, but not be limited to:
 - a) information on the Library's vision, mission and values as outlined in the Strategic Plan
 - b) an overview of the *Public Libraries Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P44
 - c) an overview of the GPL Board bylaws and governance policies
 - d) a discussion on the purpose, structure, function and responsibilities of the Library Board
 - e) a tour of the library, an introduction to employees and services as well as a library membership
 - f) a copy of the Gravenhurst Public Library Board Handbook
- 2. At the beginning of a new term of the Board the CEO/Chief Librarian will ensure the newly constituted Board receives its orientation at its inaugural meeting.
- 3. Each board member will be responsible for updating their *Gravenhurst Public Library Board Handbook* which includes:
 - a) a copy of *Cut to the Chase: Ontario Public Library Governance at a Glance*. (Ontario Library Boards' Association)



- b) Public Libraries Act R.S.O. 1990
- c) Procedural By-Law No. 2021-01
- d) a copy of the Library's staffing structure
- e) a copy of Board meeting materials for the previous three months
- f) a copy the current budget, prior year's actuals and financial statements
- g) a copy of the Library's strategic planning document
- h) the Board Policy Manual
- i) a copy of the *Library Board Development Kit* (Southern Ontario Library Service)
- 4. Board members will receive training on the Ontario Human Rights Code as well as the accessibility standards set out in the Regulations of the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disability Act* (AODA).
